In 2015, there was an estimated 705,264 ATVs and 432,219 ROVs in operation.



In 2015, Ontario residents spent \$974 million on activities directly involving the operation of All-terrain Vehicles (ATVs) and recreational off-highway vehicles (ROVs).



In 2021, the OFATV has 13,550+ members and 6500km of trails and these numbers continue to grow.



OFATV has grown over the years and now proudly represents 22 ATV clubs in Ontario.

MANDATORY ATV TRAINING FOR YOUTH 16 AND UNDER

RECOGNIZE OFATV AS THE LEADING AND ONLY ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE FEDERATION IN ONTARIO

TO STRUCTURE THE REGULATION OF ATVS AND THE OFATV THE SAME AS THE ONTARIO FEDERATION OF SNOWMOBILE CLUBS (OFSC)

4

TO DEVELOP AN ATV LICENSE FEE THAT FUNDS OPERATION OF THE FEDERATION, BUILDING AND MAINTAINING TRAILS, AND THE ENGAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION EFFORTS COMPLETED BY THE FEDERATION, SAME AS OFSC.
